

Accommodations Made for Greek Organizations that Reside in Husky Village

Residential Life will make the following accommodations for Greek Organizations residing in Husky Village

**Policy Housing Application:

Accommodation for Greek

Housing Application:

All students interested in living on campus must submit a housing application. Current resident or students participating in an off-campus program must submit their application by the deadline in January.

If a member of a Greek Organization submits the housing application late s/he may still be allowed to live in the Husky Village facility. However, before the assignment can take place, a Housing Application must be submitted.

Semester Limit:

No student will be allowed to live on campus for more than eight semesters unless there are no students on a waiting list for housing. The only exceptions to this rule are those students guaranteed housing. Semesters lived on campus are cumulative, including undergraduate and graduate/post-baccalaureate work

If a Greek Organization requires particular officers to reside in the house, and these students have exceeded the eight-semester limit, then these students will be assigned to housing after the On-Line Housing Selection Process has concluded.

If after the conclusion of the On-Line Housing Selection Process, a particular organization has vacancies in their house, and there are no members of the organization both eligible to live on campus (by Residential Life standards) and desiring to live in Husky Village, the organization can add waiting list students to their Husky Village roster (with the exception of students on the waiting list as a result of judicial action).

Lottery:

Students affected by the lottery are not eligible to select housing for themselves or be pulled into housing by a student who is eligible for the On-Line Housing Selection process. These students are automatically placed on the waiting list for on-campus housing. Students on the waiting list will be offered housing when and if spaces become available, but are not guaranteed housing.

The same exceptions apply to Greek Organization members affected by the lottery as those affected by the eight-semester housing limit

Readmitted Students and Campus Change Students who have Previously Lived in On-Campus Housing:

Students who have been readmitted to the University and students who are changing enrollment from a regional campus back to the Storrs campus, are not guaranteed housing and are placed on the waiting list for housing. Students on the waiting list will be offered housing when and if spaces become available, but are not guaranteed housing.

The same exceptions apply to Greek Organization members who have been readmitted to the University or are changing campuses back to Storrs, as those listed above for those affected by the lottery or by the eight-semester housing limit.

Number of Occupants in a Room:

An individual assigned to a double room should be prepared to accept a roommate at any point during the academic year.

If there are unfilled vacancies in a Husky Village house, the organization is expected to pay for these spaces. Options for the Greek organizations not offered to students living elsewhere on campus include; the organization purchasing a double room as a single, or Residential Life would allow an individual member to do this for him/herself.

Body Swaps and Moves to Vacancies:

An individual may swap housing assignments with another individual on campus or move into a vacancy on campus during the swap/moves to vacancies process that occurs each semester. Certain criteria still applies; only honors students can live in honors housing and only freshmen can live in freshmen only housing and only students of the same gender can swap rooms with each other.

Members of Greek Organizations can only body swap with the permission of their organization. (Body swaps are one for one moves.) Greek Organization members cannot move out of Husky Village into a space in a traditional residential facility unless the organization agrees to pay for the vacancy created when the member moves out of the village. Additionally, no student living in a traditional residential facility may move into a vacancy in Husky Village after the first day of classes in any semester.

Students Eligible to Participate in Housing Selection Have One Opportunity to Choose a Space on Campus:

Non-Greek Organization members can choose a space on campus or be pulled into a space by a roommate. After this has occurred, the assignment will not be changed without the student submitting A Room Change Request Application. (Moves through this process are not guaranteed.)

Students who are members of Greek Organizations that have houses in Husky Village, and who are eligible to participate in Housing Selection could either sign the organization's housing roster prior to selection to be placed in the Village, or they could select a space on campus during the On-Line Selection Process and then change their minds and sign a Husky Village housing roster and be moved from the first assignment chosen, to the one in Husky Village.
